

Georgia Federal-State Inspection Service offers the following services in the State of Georgia through a cooperative agreement with the USDA and GDA. We are a 501(c)3 Non-Profit organization that does not receive government funding, but rather charges fees for the services we provide.

The largest three commodities we inspect are:

- Peanuts

For the 2019 season, the tonnages for peanuts are as follows:

Georgia Totals = 1,398,582 tons

National Totals = 2,752,723 tons

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- Onions (including Vidalia)
- Pecans

These audits assure buyers, from local restaurants and farmers markets to regional, national and international food distributors, that producers have met required food safety standards and marketing practices. The Good Agricultural Practices (GAP), Good Handling Practices (GHP), GAP Harmonized, and GAP Harmonized Plus+ audits we perform are acknowledged by the Global Food Safety Initiative and fulfills requirements of the Food and Drug Administration's Food Safety Modernization Act Produce Safety Rule, the industry-driven Produce GAP Harmonization Initiative, and industry best practices in the United States.
